






Seek a dialogue with school leaders – and enter that dialogue with an open mind, aiming to learn as well as to share information

Ask for specific ideas on how to make your proposal/program/idea more appealing and less burdensome to adopt



Do your research

Be courteous of other issues facing schools



Stress that you have a solution and/or how that solution fits in with current policies and goals



Develop a relationship before making a request

When engaging school board members, begin by identifying areas of mutual agreement about issues, and then work toward a specific plan


