Summary of Job Duties:

The Youth & Family Advocate provides both individual and group support, peer-counseling, and appropriate learning to children, youth and families who have experienced domestic violence. This advocate will provide emotional and practical support to the children/teens and their parents. Advocate will also provide support to school-based prevention projects.

Responsibilities:

- Work closely with the Manager of Support Services to plan and implement case management for children and youth and parents.
- Assist families with school related requests and supplies.
- Work with parents to access resources and services related to children/youth and parenting.
- Assist mothers with parenting questions, resources and provide one to one educational parenting sessions as appropriate.
- Provide advocacy, information and referrals and crisis intervention services as needed.
- Act as liaison and technical support to Alum Rock Counseling Center on school based prevention curriculum.
- Develop and facilitate a drop-in teen space.

Requirements:

- Completion of CA Domestic Violence 40 hour training
- Education or experience equivalent to Bachelor's degree in early childhood education, psychology, counseling, social work or related field.
- Minimum of two years progressive experience working directly with children/youth in shelter or other, similar setting with at least six months' experience working with domestic violence.
- Commitment to services that enrich children's lives and that are developmentally appropriate experiences for our young clients.
- Knowledge of ACEs and the needs of children exposed to domestic violence.
- Knowledge of youth violence prevention strategies and evidence based practices.
- Dedication to supporting children in culturally competent ways.
- Excellent organization, time management and follow-up skills.
- Ability to work as a part of a team.
- Bilingual (Spanish/English) required.
- Completed CPR certification.
- Requires valid California driver's license, car and insurance.
